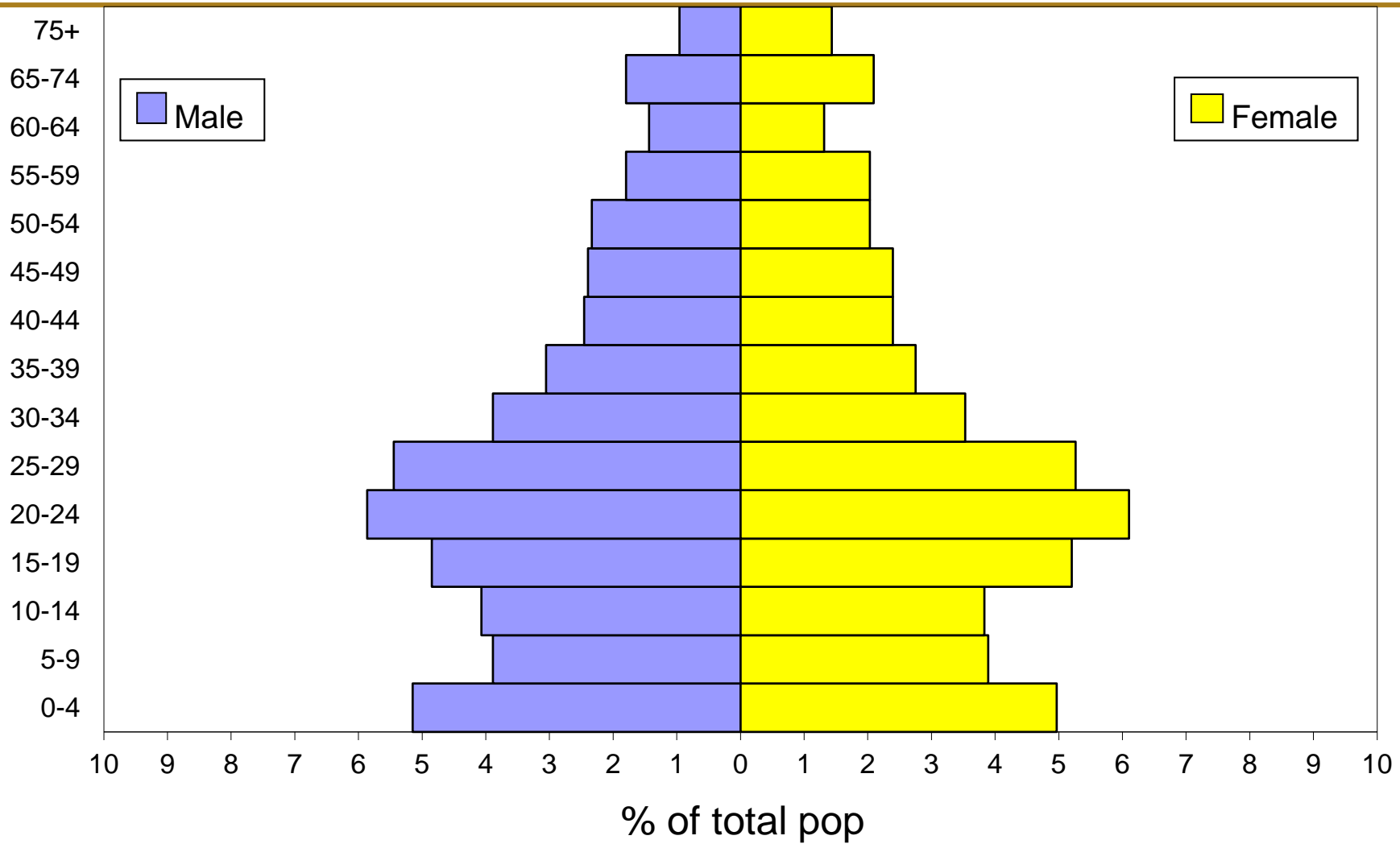
Non-Metropolitan BC Today

 - ~\$70 billion in potential resource projects over next 10 years
- Challenge: to leverage investment to create the next 'long boom'

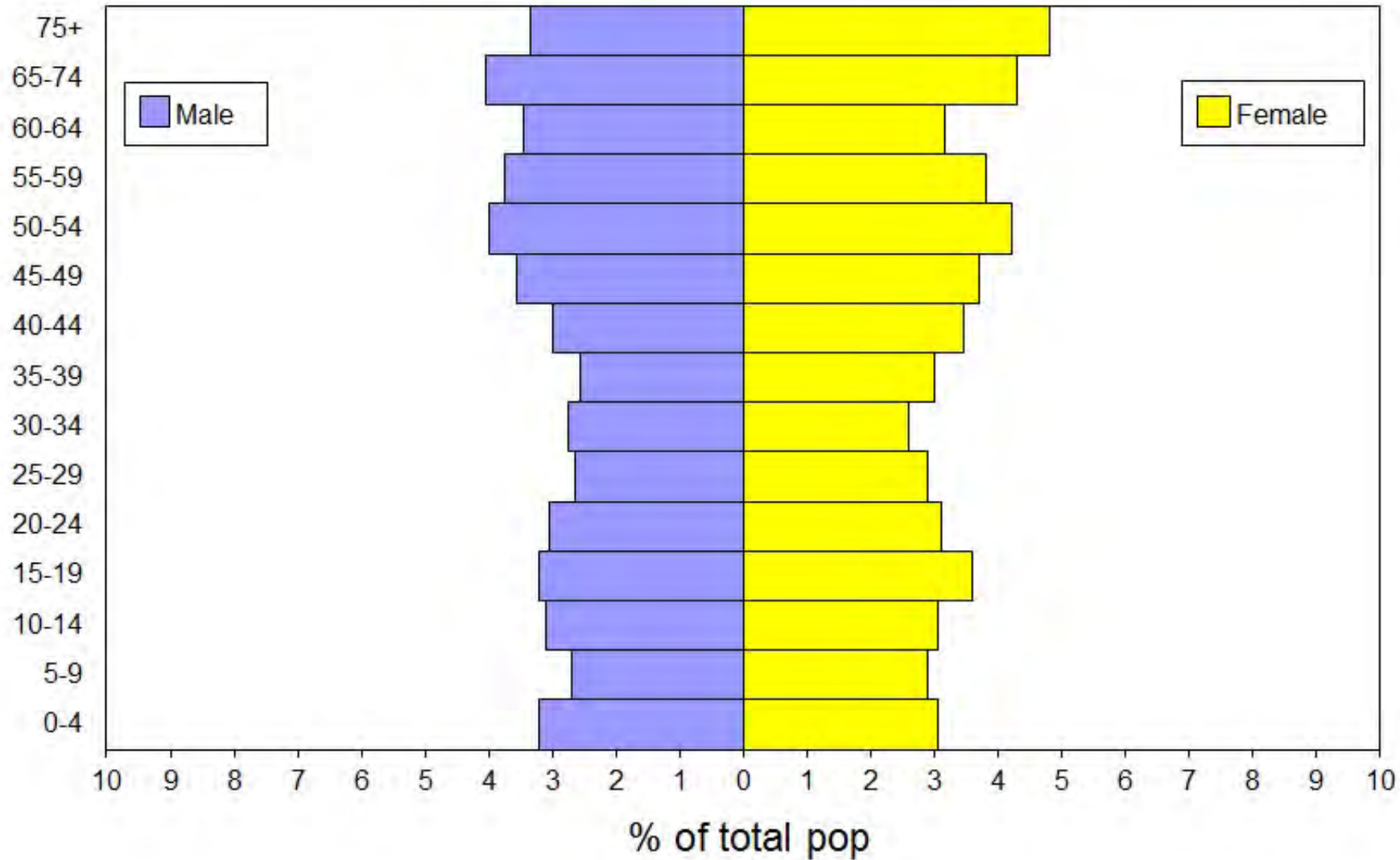
Demographic Transformation

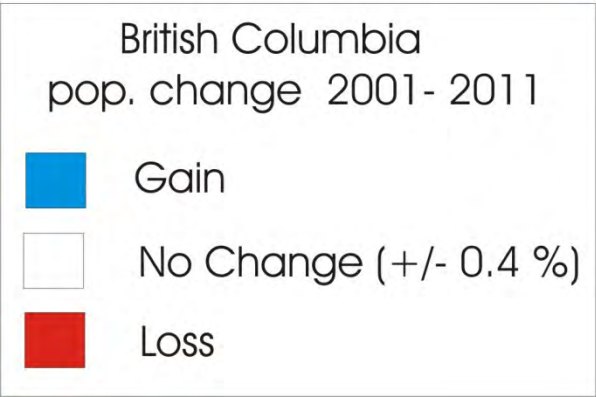
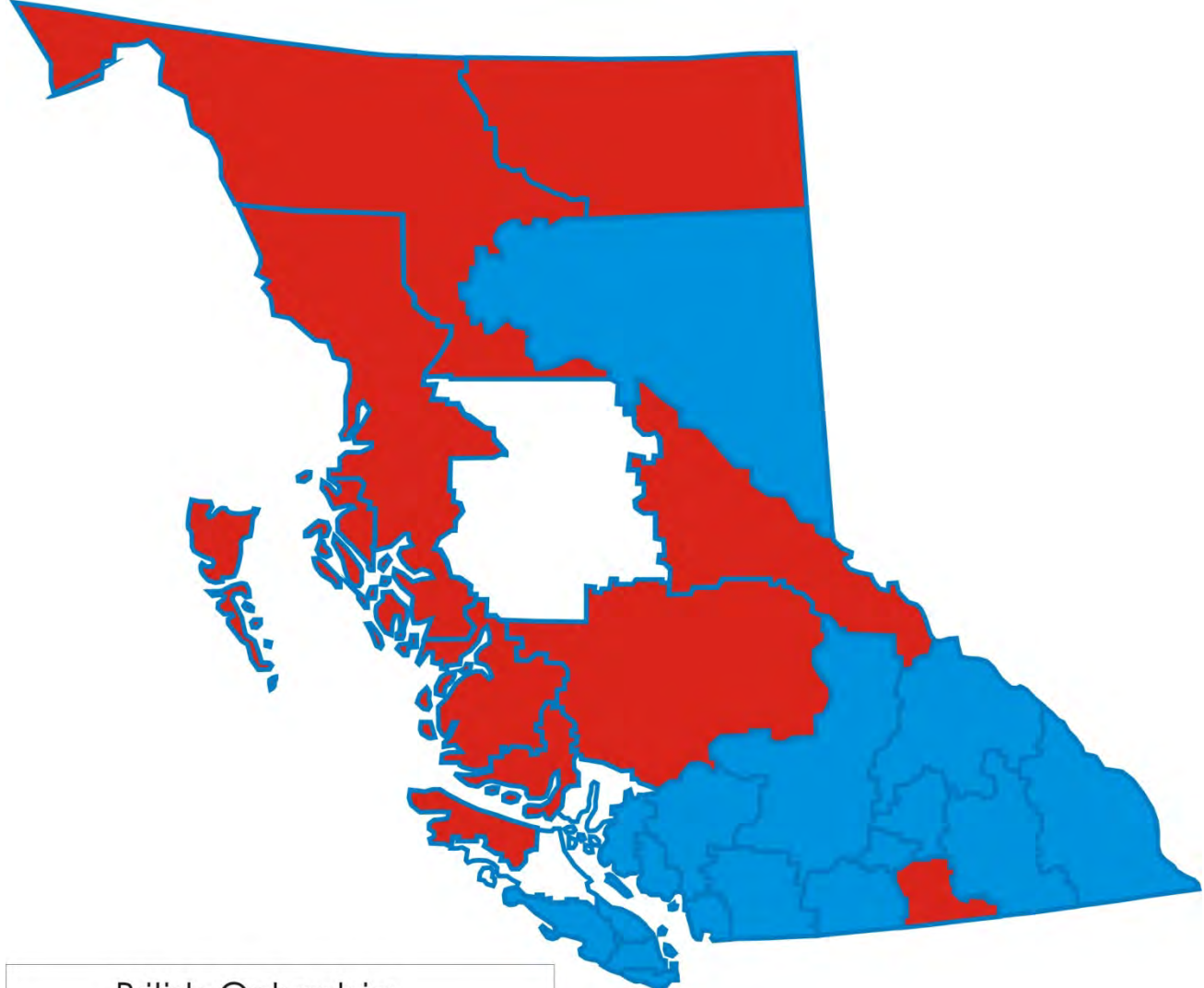






British Columbia
