


Question 1 - What is your gender identity?

Question 2 - What is your age bracket?






Question 1 - Without any additional context, do you believe the speaker is worried about their community's loss of shared culture due to the environmental circumstances?


Question 2 - Do you think the speaker argues — at least in part — based on personal


Question 1 - With the additional context given, do you believe the speaker is worried about her community's loss of culture due to the environmental circumstances?


${\rm Q14}$ - ${\rm Do}$ you think the speaker argues — at least in part — based on personal spiritual


Question 1 - Overall, do you agree with the speaker's statement?





disrespected by the person or entity they're addressing?





Question 2 - Do you think the speaker feels culturally disrespected by the person or






