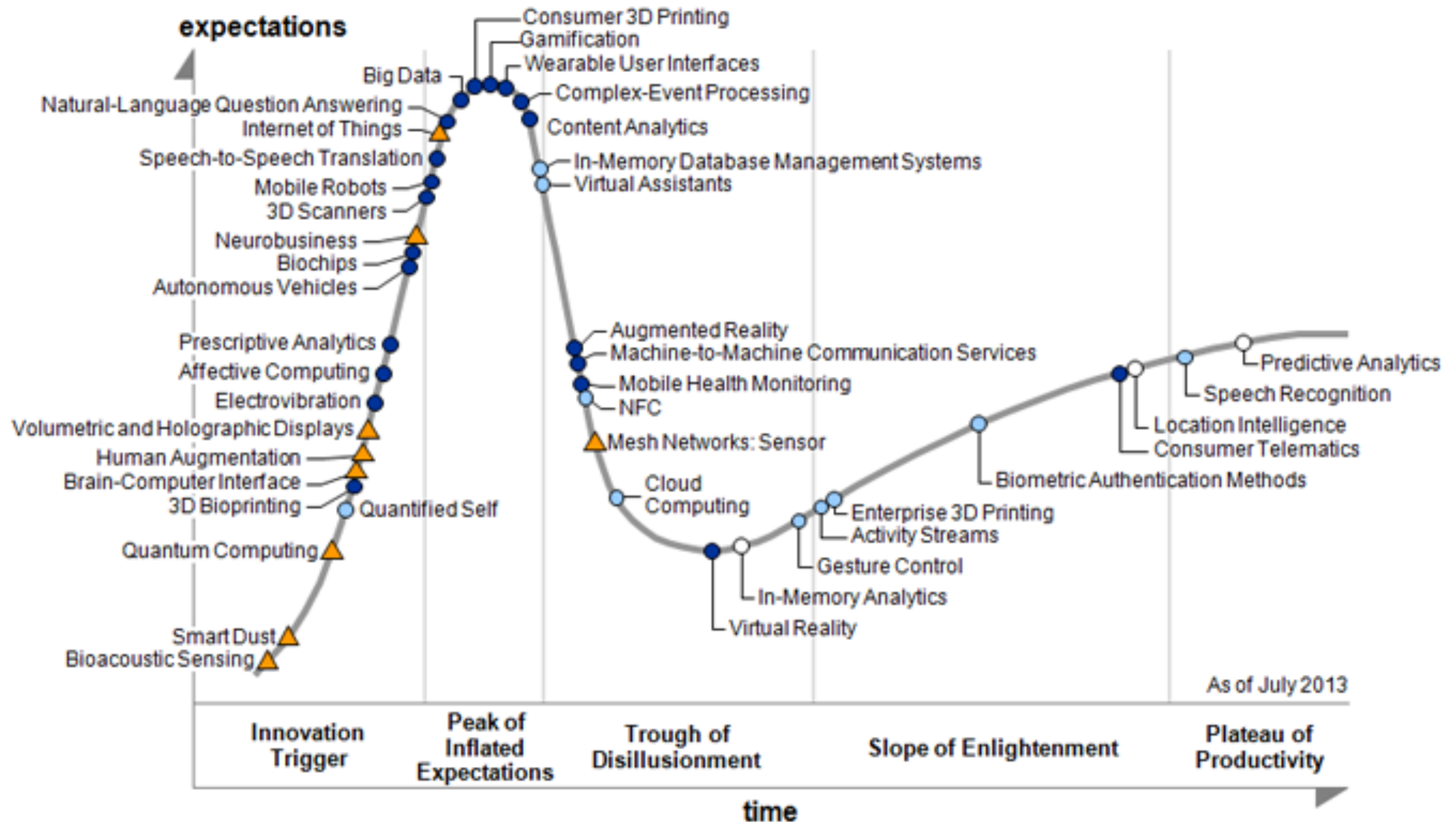

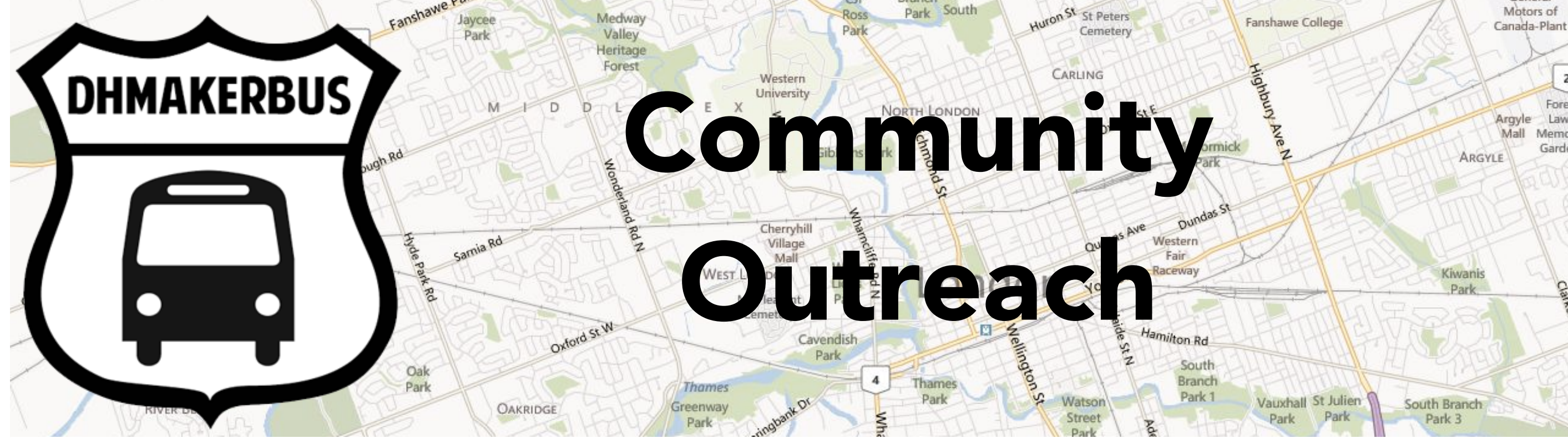


Plateau will be reached in:

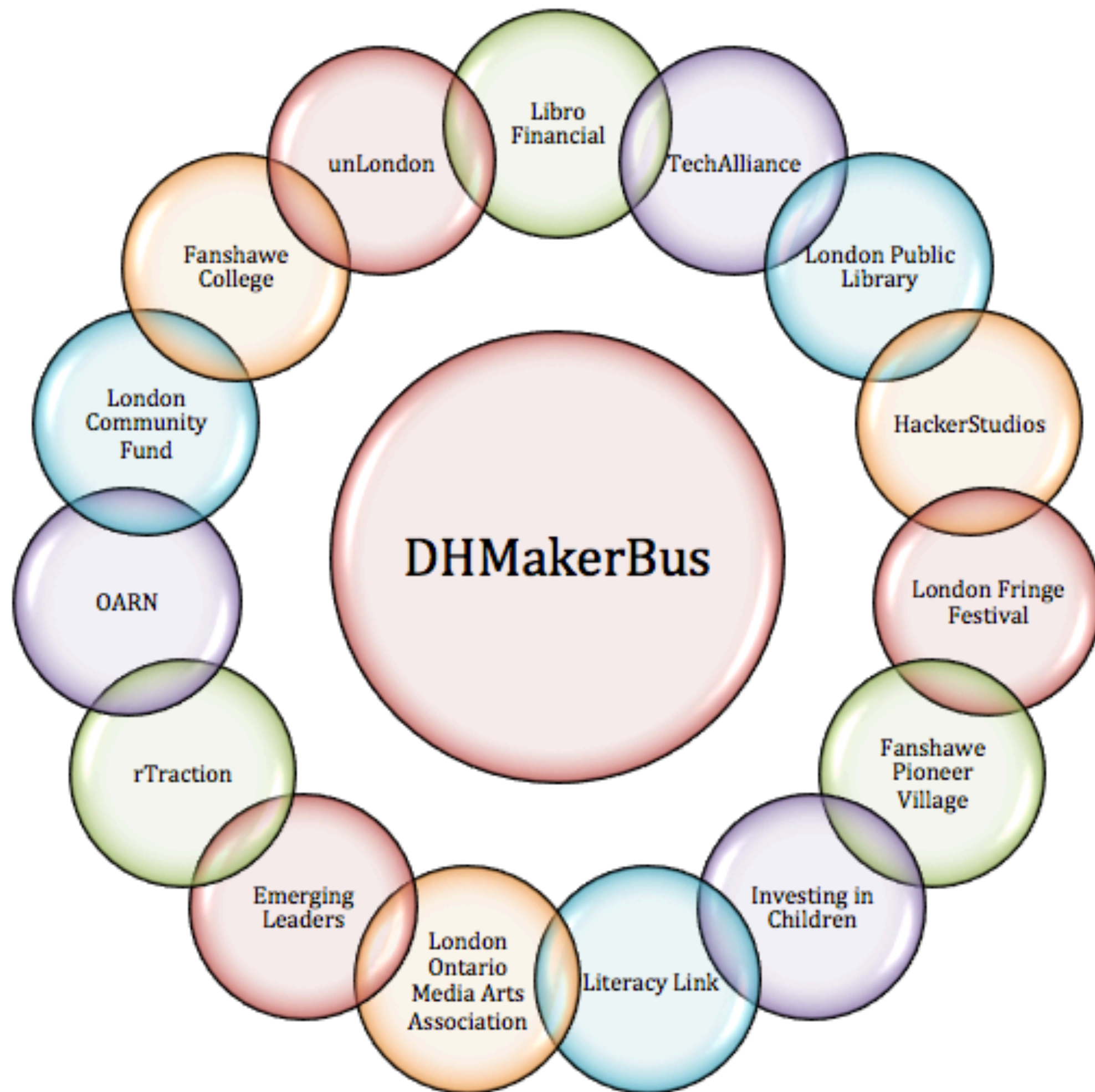


